Principal's Message

As the second quarter progresses, I notice that the students have settled into excellent work and study habits, which teachers are pleased to see. Our students are enthusiastic, committed and showing maturity in establishing a friendly rapport with their teachers.



In recent assemblies and in the Homebase program, we have been addressing such issues as taking responsibility for your own actions and self-discipline in all aspects of life – inside and outside the classroom.

OFS semester examinations begin on Monday, 26 November 2018. Each course has an examination which is worth 30% of the semester grade. This reinforces the fact that continuous assessment during quarters 1 and 2 (assignments, projects, tests and oral presentations) forms 70% of the semester grade. High School students are permitted to take study leave, with parent/guardian written permission, during the examination period. A letter to this effect has been posted home.

Please note that after the examination period classes will continue, as normal, to the end of the first semester on Friday, 14 December 2018.

Grade level meetings and Homebase time in the month of November will focus on revision skills, examination techniques and relaxation tips, to promote balance in students' lives.

On Tuesday, 29 January 2019, we will hold our Grade 8 Parents' Curriculum Night, and then on Wednesday, 13 February 2019, our Grade 10 Parents' Curriculum Night. These evenings provide detailed explanations of the programs students will follow through both Junior and Senior High School. 

IB Diploma News – Education For Life

IB LEARNER PROFILE

The IB Learner Profile unifies the principles across all IB programs. There are 10 attributes listed within the Learner Profile, three of which are described in more detail below:

Inquirers: We nurture our curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. We know how to learn independently and with others. We learn with enthusiasm and sustain our love of learning throughout life.

Coursework projects, investigations, and the Extended Essay target this attribute.

Knowledgeable: We develop and use conceptual understanding, exploring knowledge across a range of disciplines.

We engage with issues and ideas that have local and global significance.

Course content, Theory of Knowledge (TOK) and Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) target this attribute.

Thinkers: We use critical and creative thinking skills to analyse and take responsible action on complex problems. We exercise initiative in making critically and creatively to recognize and approach complex problems, and make reasoned, ethical decisions.

Course content, TOK and CAS target this attribute.

IB DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

The following is a list of the conditions for failing to meet the requirements for an IB diploma.

These codes apply to all candidates:

- Total points are less than 24
- Total HL points are less than 12
- Total SL points are less than 9
- A grade E has been awarded for either EE or TOK
- A grade of 1 or N (no grade) in any subject
- Grade of 3 or below has been awarded four or more times
- Grade of 2 has been awarded three or more times
- CAS requirements have not been met

GRADE 12

IB Registration

- Students have been given the registration approval forms for the May 2019 examination session. The signed forms should have been returned to the school by 26 October 2018.
- Late registration fees apply to subject changes after Thursday, 15 November 2018. Refund of fees will not be given for registration withdrawals after this date.

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

• Students should be finishing their CAS program this semester.

Extended Essay (EE)

• The final submission deadline for the EE has passed and students will be meeting with the EE supervisors over the next few weeks to complete their final reflection.

GRADE 11

IB Courses

- Students should now have a good understanding of the nature of each course they are taking, along with an understanding of the expected level of achievement.
- Time management and organisational skills are crucial to success throughout the program.

Model United Nations (MUN) is in full swing this year, with more opportunities for youth to develop key 21st Century skills. In September 2018, 30 High School students attended the 3-Day MUN conference at UWCSEA, building their research, public speaking and organisational skills across a range of committees from beginner level to advanced. On 20 October 2018, twelve of our club members attended the first SASMUN at the American School in Woodlands, taking part in specialist committees such as Security Council, Advisory Panel, and Crisis Committees. These high-end committees challenged our students to strengthen their critical thinking and collaboration skills.

The Recycling Club in the High School is working hard to make sure that all of the paper used in school gets recycled. Each week, a team of 25 students collects paper from every room in the High School from the handmade recycling bins provided by the club. This paper then gets sorted into three groups. Some of the paper gets used as printer paper for a designated recycled paper printer, some gets made into notebooks, and the rest is sent off for general recycling. It is the goal of the club that no paper just gets thrown away. The group estimated that they save a tree a month just by reusing paper. Students involved in the club in the past have often stated how much the club has changed their own personal use of paper.

Library News

Recently, OFS purchased two online databases: EBSCOhost and GALE Cengage Learning. These are both accessible at home or on campus, through our OFS IP address. They are located on the High School Library Website. Both databases are great





tools for conducting research and are of particular use to our IB Diploma students and our Personal Project students. They provide scholarly articles, journals and ebooks that are of a high caliber and quality. They offer translated works in over 30 languages, oral recordings, videos and images. There are also MLA citation tools, email and print options, as well as links to google drive. Our EBSCO options offer OFS The History and Science Reference Center as well as Explora for younger readers. GALE Cengage has the added versatility of databases of Global Issues in Context, Opposing Viewpoints, Biography in Context and National Geographic Kids. These databases are highly academic, from reputable publishers and used globally. When using these databases on your computer, I suggest using Google Chrome.
