## IB Diploma News – Education For Life

#### **GRADE 12**

Below are key dates for students in Semester Two:

- Friday, 10 January 2025: Final submission of the Theory of Knowledge essay. Formal written feedback on drafts was provided in December 2024.
- Monday, 13 January 2025, Period 5: Grade 12 students will share their EE, TOK, or CAS experiences with Grade 11 students. Participation is optional but highly encouraged, with opportunities to work solo or collaboratively. Judges will be present and certificates will be awarded.
- Thursday, 16 January 2025: Final submission of the Extended Essay. Formal written feedback on drafts was provided in October 2024.
- Monday, 3 March 2025 to Wednesday, 12 March 2025: IB DP Mock Examinations. The schedule will be available on the school website, and students will receive individual timetables. Language B Orals will be scheduled afterward.
- Monday, 28 April 2025 to Wednesday, 21 May 2025: IB Examination period. Full IB Diploma students and Grade 12 course students will have study leave starting Thursday, 17 April 2025.

#### **GRADE 11**

#### **Extended Essay**

The Extended Essay process begins formally on Wednesday, 8 January 2025, with introductory subject seminars. Students must select their subject and topic by March 2025. Supervisors will be assigned to guide them through their EE journey.

#### Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS)

By the end of Grade 11, students should have completed two-thirds of their CAS requirements. Planning and selecting sufficient engagements in Semester Two is essential to meet this target.

## **Academic Advisors Update**

#### **UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS**

We are now processing applications to universities worldwide. Our students will receive their results from December 2024 to April 2025. So far, some students have already received offers from King's College London (English), the University of Manchester (Biomedical Sciences, Management), Durham University (English Literature), Hull York Medical School (Medicine), Loughborough (English with placement year, Bioengineering with placement year), University of Sydney (Chemical Engineering).

#### **PSAT RESULTS**

The PSAT (Preliminary SAT) was held on Tuesday, 22 October 2024 and results were available on Thursday, 7 November 2024.

Our students outperformed global averages in both Reading and Mathematics. On average, our students scored 1161 out of 1520 across all grade levels, while the global average is 954 out of 1520. In Reading, our school's average score was 584 out of 760, compared to a global average of 486. Similarly, in Mathematics, our students averaged 577 out of 760, while the global average was 468. A huge congratulations goes to Samhita Uppalapati (G11), who scored a perfect score of 1520.

> It was inspiring to witness delegates collaborating to address contemporary and pressing issues. We were also delighted to host schools from Cambodia and Thailand once again.





## UKMT Senior Mathematics Challenge (Thursday, 3 October 2024)

65 Grades 11 and 12 students participated in the 2024 online version of the UKMT Senior Mathematics Challenge. Our students once again performed at an exceptionally high level with just under 30% of OFS students achieving the coveted Gold Level Award (world average approx. 9%), and over 80% achieving a Gold-Bronze award.

Overall 18 students achieved the top Gold Level Certificate, 17 achieved a Silver Level and 18 Bronze Level.

Pride of place this year goes to top scorer, Grade 11 student **Noh Hyeonggyun (Harry)**, who was highest in the school/joint highest in the world with an outstanding perfect score of 125/125. A remarkable performance!







Very honorable mentions also to **Towako Honda** (Best in Grade 12), **Ji Sicheng** and **Dai Ximeng** who all achieved particularly impressive scores of over 110/125.

Well done to all those who participated, improving their problem solving techniques and critical thinking skills in the process.
