Principal's Message

The second quarter of the High School calendar is one of the busiest periods of the academic year. CultureFest rehearsals and preparations are in full swing, and our students are achieving significant academic milestones. Our Grades 10 and 12 students have successfully completed



both their Personal Project (PP) as well as the first draft of their Extended Essay (EE), marking an impressive culmination of work spanning over a year and a half. It was truly inspiring to witness their accomplishments at our well-attended PP exhibition in the OFS Auditorium.

Students also had the opportunity to participate in the PSAT, which serves as an excellent platform for them to practice for the SAT and identify areas of strength, as well as areas needing further development. Our Grades 11 and 12 students excelled in the annual Senior UKMT Mathematics Competition, winning several gold, silver, and bronze awards. Additionally, the MUN season has commenced, with students recently completing the MUNUWC conference and are now preparing for the massive MUNOFS event that will be held on our campus.

As global citizens, our students are encouraged to take on leadership roles in projects that positively impact their community. Initiatives include MINDS, RDA, NTUC Health Nursing Home, Red Cross, beach clean-ups, and the UN Global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In line with these efforts, this year's Peace Week focused on fostering a culture of peace, featuring a talk by Venerable Phra Goh Adhibalo at our annual Peace Week assembly.

The OFS semester examinations will begin on Thursday, 28 November 2024. Each course examination accounts for 30% of the semester grade, while the remaining 70% is based on assessments completed during quarters 1 and 2. High School students are permitted to take study leave during the examination period with written permission from a parent or guardian. A letter outlining this has been sent home.

Please note that after the examination period, classes will continue as normal until the end of semester one on Friday, 13 December 2024.

EXTENDED ESSAY

Grade 12 students submitted their Extended Essay (EE) draft on Monday, 14 October 2024. This core component challenges students' time management and reflection skills while helping them develop an understanding of the necessary steps for a long-term research project. Students are expected to work on the feedback provided by their supervisors on the draft EE and have regular check-in meetings with them. The final EE is due on Thursday, 16 January 2025. Together with Theory of Knowledge (TOK), students can earn a maximum of 3 IB DP points for their EE.




Junior High School News

GRADE 12 UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS

The university application process enters full swing at OFS this month, with most of our Grade 12 learners preparing their applications to a range of universities worldwide. Academic Advisors have been working with students and their teachers to support this process. A busy time for all!

In total, 43 students (21 students from Grade 9, 11 students from Grade 10, and 11 students from Grade 11) completed the PSAT (Preliminary SAT) in October. It is a 2 ½ hour aptitude test and contains evidence-based reading, writing and mathematics sections. It is intended to be a useful practice for the SAT, which assesses students' readiness for college and is part of the admissions requirements of many universities in the United States, Singapore and Hong Kong.


German Project Field Trips




Grades 9 and 10 Dance
