


MAY 2024 IB RESULTS

As we embark on a new academic year, I am delighted to share the outstanding achievements of our Grade 12 students in this year's IB Examinations. These results are incredibly impressive, especially considering that OFS follows an open entry policy. This sets us apart from the majority of schools, not only in Singapore but also around the world, which typically pre-select students for the Diploma program in advance.

Mathematics focus: Exploring and modelling Marina Bay area

In April 2024, the Grade 11 HL Math Applications Interpretations students set off on a field trip to Gardens by the Bay. With graphical display calculators in hand, students graphed the Supertrees with logistic functions, fitted parabolic



functions around the Flower Dome. We also calculated the cost of producing these buildings using various materials such as glass panels, steel rods and concrete. The students discovered that the Singapore Flyer is not a true circle, but a 56-sided polygon! This trip was an interactive way for students to develop ideas for their Mathematical explorations and apply the skills learned in class to the world around them.


