

The K1 children have been busy creating magnificent masterpieces during our large-scale markmaking sessions. They explored the world of colours and textures using different art materials. The children also had a lot of fun exploring metal, nature, wood, and cloth materials. From the cool touch of metal to the organic feel of nature, each material has played a unique role in sparking creativity and innovation in K1 children during their time at our Learning Centre. The children have been architects, builders, and storytellers, constructing and deconstructing their own worlds. As a link to Book Week, the teachers linked the loose parts play to some fairy tales like "The Three Little Pigs" and "The Three Billy Goats Gruff". Exploration of boxes is also another popular activity, our creative thinkers have transformed simple containers into castles,

K2 News
















The K2 children have continued to build on their Mathematical skills this semester. We have covered a variety of concepts and linked the topics to our Unit "From A to B". The children begin by exploring mathematical concepts practically using various manipulatives such as cubes, counting bears, beads, and numicon, as well as using tools such as dice, rekenrek (abacus), number lines, and 100 squares. They also had opportunities to record their learning on whiteboards or sometimes a recording sheet.

Number

The K2 children have also been working on simple subtraction, practically, exploring the concept of 'taking away' using cubes or other manipulatives. The children are now more familiar with related vocabulary such as minus, take away, subtract, less, left. Many have been able to tell simple subtraction stories incorporating transport, e.g. "Five children were on the MRT. Two children got off at the next stop. Three children were left". We talked about strategies we can use to help with subtraction like counting on fingers or using a number line. The children are also beginning to write simple subtraction sentences and will be continuing to practice this throughout the semester.

We have also been discussing ordinal numbers. We read a version of the Lunar New Year Zodiac story, and discussed the order in which the animals won the race. The children are having great fun with simple competitions in the classroom to see who came first, second, third, and so on.



The children had a great time celebrating our 100th day of school!

We incorporated many number activities into the day, and the children had a lot of practice counting by 10s to make 100. We went on a '100th day walk' where the children walked around Kindergarten following numbers from 1 to 100. At every '10 numbers' mark, they had an activity to complete — such as 10 jumping jacks, 10 hops, or tossing a beanbag to a friend 10 times. They were thrilled to receive a little prize when they got to 100. The children had such creative costumes or accessories with 100 items on them as well, a big thank you to parents for your support and effort!

Shape

The K2 children revisited basic 2D shapes such as triangle, square, rectangle, circle, and oval. We discussed their properties, observing how many sides and corners each shape has. We also linked it to our unit "From A to B" by having children observe the types of shapes that might be found in various forms of transport i.e. circles for wheels, squares for windows, and rectangles for a bicycle's handlebars! After that, they had a go at creating a type of transport using 2D shapes. They were very creative!

As the semester continues, we will continue to work on these concepts and will move on to other topics such as estimation, simple fractions (half, quarters, thirds), and measuring and comparing length, mass, and capacity using non-standard units.
