



# IB Diploma News – Education For Life

### **EXTENDED ESSAY**



The due date for Grade 12 students to submit their Extended Essay (EE) draft is on Monday, 13 October 2025. This core component challenges students' time management and reflection skills while helping them develop an understanding of the necessary steps for a long-term research project. Students are expected to work on the feedback provided by their supervisors on the EE draft and have regular check-in meetings with them. The final EE is due on Thursday, 15 January 2026.

#### **IMPORTANT DATES**

- Many final Internal Assessment deadlines are still to come in the second and the third quarter:
  - Group 1 HL Essays, Language Acquisition: Individual Orals, some Group 3, 4 and 5 Internal Assessment (IA) coursework, and the TOK essay amongst them. Students are encouraged to check their calendar to be aware of these dates and ensure their submissions are made before the relevant deadlines.
- Arts: The IA and early External Assessment uploads will be done in quarter 3.
- Students will be finishing their CAS program in guarter 3.
- Mock examination week: Monday, 2 March 2026 to Friday, 13 March 2026.

#### **UNIVERSITY APPLICATION NEWS**

September has been a busy month. Our Lion City University Fair was an overwhelming success, with approximately 130 universities in attendance worldwide. Students and parents



from Grade 9 to 12 had the opportunity to speak to university representatives to ask questions about the application process, entry requirements and more!

Also, our Grade 10 students and parents were introduced to how to choose courses for Grade 11, while our Grade 11 students were introduced to the university application process. Thank you to everyone who joined.

Grade 12 students met individually with their Academic Advisors to prepare their post-graduation plans. Several special Academic Advisor sessions were organised for Grade 12 students during the Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences. Students participated in workshops on how to write Personal Statements for UK university applications and



Common Application essays for US university applications. Students spoke with a University of California representative to ask questions about the admissions process and application form.

Our early university application process has also started, with some students preparing to complete their Oxbridge and Medical/Veterinary applications shortly.

# **PSAT TESTING – TUESDAY, 14 OCTOBER 2025**

Our school will be administering the PSAT on Tuesday, 14 October 2025. The PSAT not only provides students with structured practice for the SAT, but also helps them identify strengths and areas for growth as they prepare for future testing. As U.S. universities increasingly place renewed emphasis on SAT scores in their admissions process, this assessment offers students an important early step toward readiness and confidence.

Students should regularly check their University Application Timeline, Homebase Learning Portal, the Gazette, and the Academic Advisors' website for important information on resources, workshops, meetings and updates.

At lunchtime, the campus


